Fires should not be lit in urban or maintained areas. Please keep your fire small and well supervised and only use dead vegetation and trees to fuel your fire. Remember if there has been a prolonged dry period, fires can easily get out of control, so it is best to avoid lighting one.

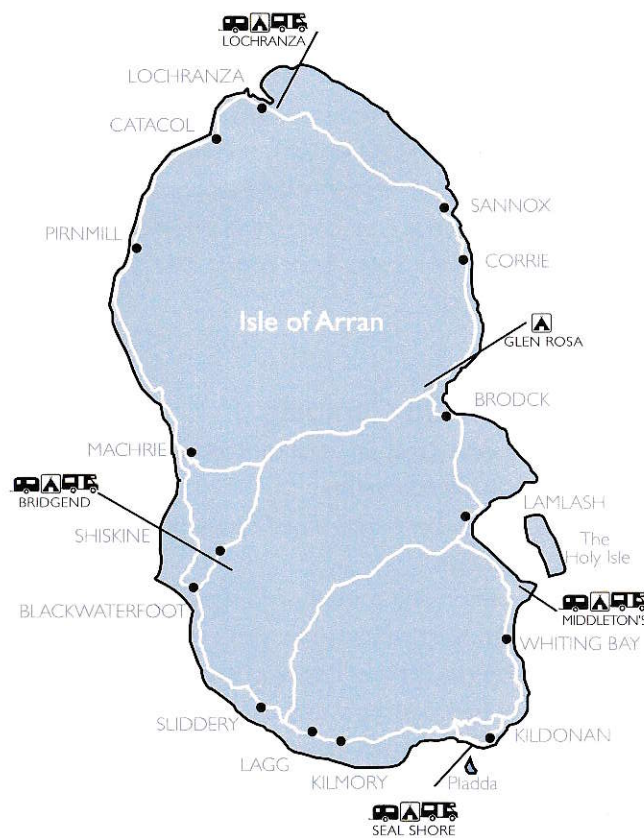
Litter

There are many litter bins on the island and a waste recycling centre and transfer station on Market Road in Brodick.

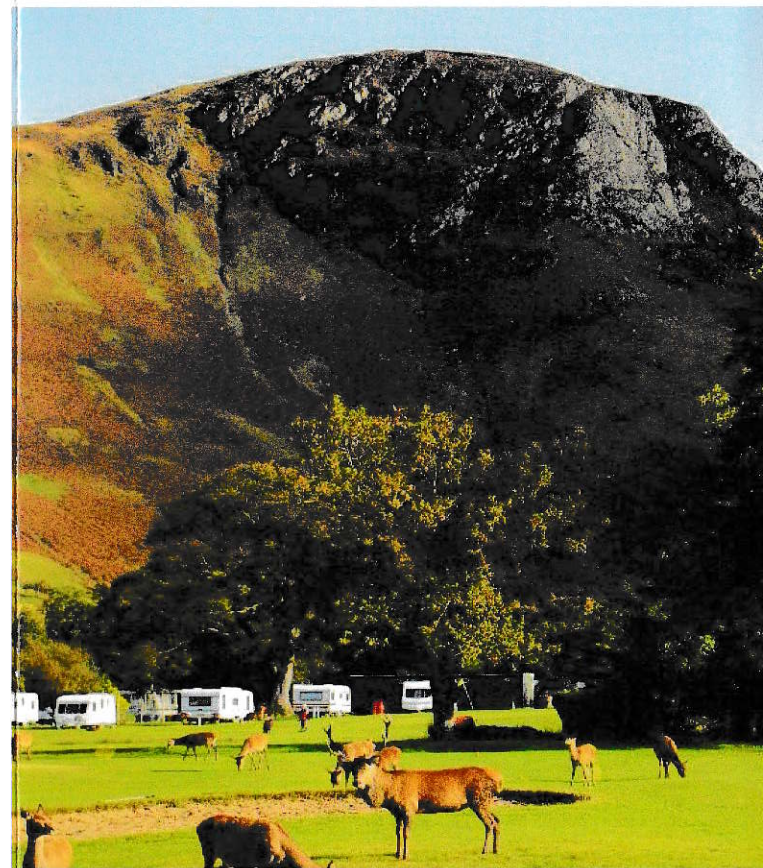

Travel on Arran

Arran's roads are narrow so please drive slowly allowing enough space for other road users and allow following traffic to overtake when safe. Public transport on the island can be limited but where possible, leave your motorhome at the campsite and travel by bus.

Wild Camping

Arran has many official campsites, however if you do wish to wild camp, then please do so with consideration to humans and wild life. For human waste disposal, always use public toilets. If this is not possible please ensure that you bury any waste carefully, away from public areas, footpaths, burns and open water.

Motor Home Wild Camping

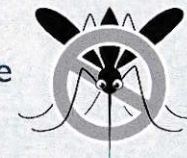
If you choose to wild camp in your motorhome, please observe the following courtesies

- Avoid parking anywhere that could cause congestion to traffic or pedestrians.
- Never park overhanging a road or footpath.
- Take care not to obstruct anyone else's view.
- Setting up camp e.g. lighting fires and erecting awnings is not advisable when parking within a village.
- Avoid parking as a group in villages.

Please remember to leave no trace of your visit!

In certain weather conditions, the "Midgie" can be annoying so be prepared by making sure that you have loads of repellent, which is widely available at Arran shops. The locals can advise on their preferred brand!

Motor Home Services

Whilst you are on the island you may require to use service points for your unit.

Chemical Toilet Disposal

Public disposal points are located at the public toilets in Blackwaterfoot and Whiting Bay. All the Campsites that take Motor homes have chemical disposal points which are for site users only.
